- I try to spend all my time reading about God and Jesus, praying, ministering to others, renewing my mind with the Word, and doing ministry!!! (Heather, Calhoun county Jail)
- I've learned so much that He's my everything, my comforter, my Redeemer, my source, my father. I'm trusting Him to guide all my steps. (Jessica, Calhoun County Jail)
- I would like to receive the Bible studies and devotionals please when you can. I've converted from Islam to Christianity and would like to receive a spiritual filling as well. Thank you and God bless you (Demarest, LCDC)
- That message really hit home. I'm always trying to lift others up and be positive. I'm ready to serve God and carry His word throughout here and tell others. I've not lost my faith. I just doubted myself and told myself I didn't deserve His love. But I know I do. I've gotten back in the word and would like to tell my story to others one day. That maybe if I can help just a few not to go down the same road then all my struggles was worth it. (Wendy, Calhoun County Jail)
- I grew up in church but as I grew I went astray from what I knew and turned to drugs and eventually up homeless and in jail! I'm blessed to be in there with Gerald as he has helped me turn my life around and realize that what I was doing wasn't working and that I needed to give my life to God! (Cody, LCDC)

- I am always excited about telling others what I been through in this journey. I know God is the only reason I am able to walk around with my head up and a smile on my face. I use my smile and my story to show people that encouragement can be given by God. He gives me joy even in my darkest hour He has me. - I encourage others by telling them my testimony like thru AA/ NA meeting then outside of the meetings I show joy and love thru being as Christ-like as possible even though I am not in the greatest position ever, going south on a 20 year sentence (Chase, LCDC)
- I've been messaging my wife with uplifting words of encouragement when she expresses her stress and fatigue of having to do everything on her own. In times past when she would express these issues to me I would speak rougher towards her more like a drill instructor rather than a loving husband and child of God. Quite frankly because I wasn't a child of God but rather in rebellion against Him. I much more enjoy the way things are now. Daily I try to always be polite and respectful in my speech and actions towards other people because I believe when we treat others with respect we show that they have value and being of value lifts up a person's spirit thus encouraging them in their own life.
