Gen 50:15-21:

15. When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "What if Joseph holds a grudge against us and pays us back for all the wrongs we did to him?" 16. So they sent word to Joseph, saying, "Your father left these instructions before he died: 17. This is what you are to say to Joseph: I ask you to forgive your brothers the sins and the wrongs they committed in treating you so badly.' Now please forgive the sins of the servants of the God of your father." When their message came to him, Joseph wept. 18. His brothers then came and threw themselves down before him. "We are your slaves," they said. 19. But Joseph said to them, "Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? 20. You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives. 21. So then, don't be afraid. I will provide for you and your children." And he reassured them and spoke kindly to them. NIV

On Wednesday nights we are studying Bible heroes and enjoyed an excellent lesson this past week about Joseph. It's a great story about God working in Joseph's life. Several bad things happened to Joseph including imprisonment. In the end we can see "through the rear view mirror" how God saved his people through Joseph.

Joseph realized that God was working through him after he was able to bring his people to Egypt. Did he realize that when he was in the pit? Or when running from Potiphers wife? Or in prison? Probably not, but he remained faithful.

In the New Testament we are told that "..... all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose. Romans 8:28. NKJV

Most of us have seen how God has worked in our lives in the past but have trouble seeing how God can work in the future as we are experiencing loss, tragedy, stress, illness or the unknown. Like Joseph we cannot understand God's perspective. Like his brothers we are afraid. We must allow God to be God and work for good in our lives. His promises remain. We have to remain faithful in the middle of stressful times.
